- Case studies and real-world applications to help students understand the process better

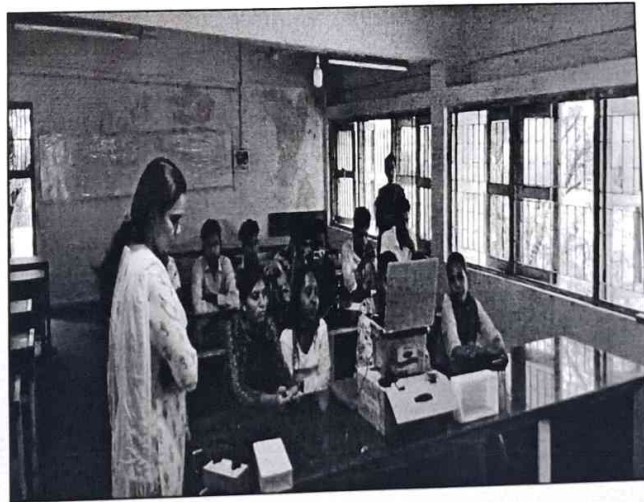
Student Participation


