The Gandhian Young Technological Innovation (GYTI) Awards 2024 celebrate the passion, creativity, and social commitment of young innovators who are solving real-world challenges through science, technology, and engineering. Organized by SRISTI in collaboration with the Honey Bee Network, GYTI has become a prestigious national platform nurturing student-led innovation across healthcare, agriculture, energy, environment, and more.

- Award category: 11 entries from 5 states, led by Karnataka
- Appreciation category: 60 entries with broad nationwide representation, led by Maharashtra and New Delhi
