He explained how the company has successfully served **30+ clients** and contributed to generating **\$10M+ revenue impact** through innovative digital solutions. He emphasized that proper documentation is essential at every stage of startup execution and highlighted the importance of ethical and legal practices while building sustainable businesses. His session motivated students to think practically about entrepreneurship and demonstrated how structured planning, documentation, and ethical decision-making play a vital role in building successful startups.
